

**RESOLUTION NO. 6, 2022**  
**A RESOLUTION REQUESTING EXPENDITURE OF AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT**  
**FUNDS ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNING BODY FOR THE TOWN OF UPTON, WESTON**  
**COUNTY, WYOMING**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the applicable federal law and released guidance regarding the American Rescue Plan Act funding received by the Town of Upton, Wyoming as a “Non-Entitlement Unit” in the amount of \$91,575.43 on June 25, 2021 the funds must be expended only on items that fall into the currently released guidance; and

**WHEREAS**, a second tranche of funding in the amount of \$91,575.43 is expected to be received in June 2022 for a total of \$183,150.86 in funding; and


**WHEREAS**, the Town of Upton has several eligible expenditures that conform with the released guidance that include but are not limited to the items identified in Resolution No. 9, 2021 and No. 11, 2021 with updated information as follows:

1. A GIS system that coordinates with the water and wastewater systems in the amount of approximately \$700.00 ;and
2. Lagoon pump equipment in the amount of approximately \$3,500.00; and
3. Solar panels for the lagoon pump in the amount of approximately \$700.00; and

**WHEREAS**, the above stated plan of expenditures continues to make efficient and adequate use of 100% of the funds received before the December 2024 deadline and that all funds will be expended or returned before December 2026 as required by federal law and released guidance to date; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF UPTON, WYOMING** that the funds received from the American Rescue Plan Act will only be expended on properly approved items brought before the governing body of the Town of Upton prior to expenditure and that all reporting requirements shall be met in accordance with federal law and released guidance regarding the ARPA funds.
